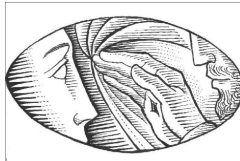


FROM THE PASTOR



A SPECIAL SABBATH – For our Jewish neighbors yesterday was the Shabbat Shuvah (The Sabbath of Repentance) or the Shabbat Shabbaton (Sabbath of Sabbaths). It was the Sabbath that falls within the ten **Days of Awe** from Rosh Hashanah (Sept. 21) and **Yom Kippur** (Sept. 30). While it is a grace to be capable of awe at anything, it is an even greater grace to be capable of religious awe. In many synagogues (including B'nai Jacob here in Phoenixville), near the ark in which the Torah scrolls are reserved, one can read the words: “Know before whom you stand.” Though not a direct biblical citation, the words come from Moses’ experience before the burning bush (Exodus 3:5) and remind congregants to have a reverent and focused attitude while attending services. Blessings to our Jewish neighbors during their religious high Holydays, their Days of Awe that will climax this Saturday with the celebration of the Day of Atonement: Yom Kippur.

AT-ONE-MENT & AWE
“Beatific Vision” is a phrase we Catholics use to bring to light an aspect of the mystery of complete and unimpeded union



with God we call Heaven. The capacity for awe in God’s Presence is an essential part of the experience of At-One-Ment. We teach that grace is not only amazing and not only saving, but even more so **sanctifying**. This means that here on earth we can begin to enjoy a **share in God’s Life**. Here in time we can begin to become like the Eternal One in whose image we have been created. My mother used to say, **“it takes one to know one,”** and I say, **“who we are is what we see.”** In the Funeral Mass we pray: “...for **seeing** you, our God, as you are we shall **become like you** for all the ages...”



AT-ONE-MENT AND REFORMATION – This October, Christians will mark the 500th anniversary of a major event in Church history when on October 31, 1517 the Augustinian monk Martin Luther nailed a document titled “Disputation

on the Power and Efficacy of Indulgences” to the door of the Castle Church in Wittenberg. Stay tuned for several local events throughout October that will be celebrating the start of the Reformation.



ECCLESIA SEMPER REFORMANDI “The Church is always reforming:” or more exactly the Church is always in need of reform by the Holy Spirit. May our celebration of

the 500th anniversary of the start of the Reformation be an occasion for us to examine ourselves in the light of the Gospel and to ask the Lord to bless us with the grace of continuing conversion. “Do not conform yourself to this age but be transformed by the renewal of your mind, that you may discern what is the will of God, what is good and pleasing and perfect” (Romans 12:2).

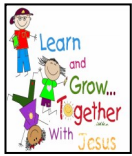

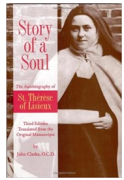

FEEDING TEAM

On October 16, 2013 the St. Ann's "Feeding Team" joined in an effort to provide a noon meal every weekday throughout the year for the less fortunate in our community at St. Peters Episcopal Church. Since then, on one of four teams assigned to each Wednesday, over 100 parishioners have provided almost 10,000 meals through this program.

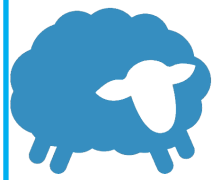
Although we have maintained a strong core of dedicated captains and team members over time, some of those involved initially have been unable to continue. In order to continue our involvement in this vital program, we really need some additional volunteers to either help in providing the food we serve or in helping to serve the meals on Wednesdays.

Providers are assigned to a team responsible for one of the Wednesdays and work with the Captain for that week to supply the ingredients required to serve a healthy meal for our guests.

Servers are assigned to a team for a specific week and work with the Captains for that week for about 2 ½ hours to help prepare and serve the meals at St. Peters.
